Pokhriyal said, "As the remaining class X and XII CBSE exams, which were earlier rescheduled to be held between July 1 to July 15 have been cancelled, the CBSE has decided to declare the results on July 15." The result will be calculated on the exams which have already been given, but the students who think they could have done better if they had taken the remaining exams, may opt for giving exams again. This option will, however, be open for students who have not taken exams for all the subjects," he added.

The spurt in online attacks from across the border was noticed after tensions rose between the two countries in eastern Ladakh, said Yashasvi Yadav, Special Inspector General of Police, cyber wing, Fraudulent email ID, such as 'ncov2019@gov.in' was found, which sent bogus information about free Covid-19 testing for residents of Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Chennai and Ahmedabad, officials said.

are broadly two types of cyberattacks: attacks where the
goal is to disable the target computer and knock it offline,
or attacks, where the goal is to get access to the target's

WHERE A cyberattack can be employed by sovereign states, individuals, groups, society or organisations; it may originate from an anonymous source as well. 
